Re: Termination of Pregnancy Services (TOPs)

North West London CCGs have recently led an Any Qualified Provider (AQP) procurement for the Termination of Pregnancy (TOP) services and Central Booking Service (CBS) on behalf of North West London CCGs for routine terminations.

We are pleased to confirm that from the 1st April 2017 four AQP providers are available for routine terminations as listed below;

- British Pregnancy Advisory Service (BPAS)
- Chelsea and Westminster NHS Foundation Trust
- Marie Stopes International (MSI)
- National Unplanned Pregnancy Advisory Service (NUPAS)

The British Pregnancy Advisory Service (BPAS) will be providing the Central Booking Service to coordinate clinic availability of all the providers listed above from 1st April 2017.

How to refer into Termination of Pregnancy Providers

As of the 1st April 2017 referrals for patients who are considering a termination of pregnancy should be made via the CBS.

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TOP Service provision may include any one or more of the following;

- Support, advice and assessment appointment
- TOP procedure
- Aftercare/post TOP support and follow-up arrangements
- Contraception

Referral criteria:

- Women registered with a GP in the geographical area covered by North West London CCGs
- Women resident within the borough of North West London CCGs

Referral exclusions are:

- Prisoner health
- Women ineligible for NHS treatment
- Women not registered with a GP or resident in the areas of any of the commissioning organisations
- Women post 24 weeks gestation
- Women requiring an overnight stay
- Complex medical cases may be excluded in some settings as per the pre-existing conditions policy
